The "Beach Litter" pack contains information on beach litter, its effects and its sources. This includes the routes it might take to our beaches, covering ocean currents, tides and winds. It also includes shipping, pointing out that shipping is far from being the greatest source of pollution, and is in fact very important to our everyday lives. It invites pupils to tell the stories of four items of litter washed up at Wembury.



The pack consists of background material and sources, a Power Point presentation, and a library of images which can be used to illustrate the stories.
